Humiston Woods Nature Center is an ongoing project of the Apollos Camp-Bennet Humiston Trust The 335 acre hardwood forest and 8 acre restored prairie along the Vermilion River in Livingston County offers a variety of outdoor experiences for all seasons.

Humiston Woods Nature Center is located between Livingston Co. Roads 1100 E. and 1200 E. on 2100 N. about 6 miles west of exit #201 on I-55.

The Woods was originally used as a scout camp and countywide picnic area. In 1975 Joseph K. Jobst and the Trust began to develop Humiston Woods Nature Center as an outdoor classroom. The Woods has over 160 varieties of native plants and accompanying wildlife to enjoy. It has evolved into a unique natural retreat for individuals, families, and groups. School programs, meetings, services, reunions, and weddings are among activities scheduled annually at HWNC.

The Nature Center offers 7 trails, 2 pavilions, 4 picnic areas, a fishing pond, a canoe dock, and includes 3 handicapped-accessible areas. Latrines are located near the parking lot and both pavilions. Overnight camping is restricted to scout troops only.

The Joseph K. Jobst Education
Building was constructed in 2007
to honor Joe's vision and 30 years
of dedicated service as Director
of the Humiston Woods Nature
Center. The log building houses the
Apollos Camp-Bennet Humiston
Trust office and a meeting room.
It is available by appointment
for school groups, meetings and
workshops.
